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
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

Small pamphlet, size: 14 x 9 cm. With eight views folded in leporello fashion. Original printed paper wrapper, with some stains on upper cover.

The pamphlet is published as a memorial of Andrée's balloon expedition. The illustrations depict the crew on the ship Svensksund, the balloon being repaired, view of Danskön; demolition of the balloon house, "last farewell" and a few more. Rare.

One sheet with content. Last two leaves titled "Biscuites Levèvre-Utile" missing eight cards. Bound in publisher's decorated boards, printed in silver and gold.

An exclusive promotional album produced to celebrate Levèvre-Utile winning the grand prize for making biscuits at the 1900 Exposition Universelle in Paris. Lefèvre Utiel (LU) is a renowned French manufacturer of biscuits and chocolate based in Nantes (now part of Mondelez International). The lavishly decorated cards were included in packages of cookies and were intended as a collector's item. Each card has a colourful artistic scene associated with a contemporary celebrity, and includes a photographic portrait of the same. The artwork was created by leading French artists and photographers of the day.

Impressive advertising manual for cover papers. Size: 28.5 x 22 cm. Containing 36 leaves with different samples of papers, two in the same colour, of which one with printed design. The patterns are provided by various customers and/or artists who have used the company's papers. Original printed covers, rubbed along edges. Inside front cover has a guide with small colour paper samples. At the rear a printed list of companies that handle Buckeye's paper. A few quires are loose but overall a well-preserved manual. Distributed by The Union Paper & Twine Co., Cleveland. Scarce.

4 BIGANDET, PAUL AMBROISE

The Life, and Legend of Gaudama, the Budha of the Burmese, with annotations. The ways to Neibban, and notice on the phongyies or Burmese Monks. Rangoon, American Mission Press, 1866. €1900

Pp. xi, (i), 538, v. Uncut copy in original printed wrappers, spine restored. Wrappers stained but internally fine. Housed in a specially made cloth box. Second enlarged edition (first 1858). An extensive work on Buddha and his doctrines. Based on the Burmese religious books and Bigandet's frequent conversations about religion amongst scholars. This second edition is greatly expanded with more information about Gautama's life as well as new details on the great intellectual processing of Gautama's mind while meditating around the Bodi tree. "Numerous notes have been added to those of the First Edition, for the purpose of elucidating and explaining, as far as we are able, the principles of Buddhism and whatever is connected with that religious system". (Preface). Bigandet, a French Catholic missionary who came



to Burma in 1837 and stayed there for most of his life. He established schools, orphanages and convents in Burma. Rare. See Herbert: World Biogr. series, vol. 132: Burma, pp. 140–145. Cordier BI 273, 290–91.

5 (BUONARROTI, FILIPPO?) / USHURMA, MANSUR La riforma dell'Alcorano e le profezie dell'aggiornante dell'illuminato e del vigilante profeta Seich-Mansur. Traduzione dall' Arabo. Fuligno, Giovanni Tomassini, 1786. € 3 600

16mo. Pp. 55. Eighteenth century decorated Italian paper wrappers. Exceedingly rare work.

Sheikh Mansur Ushurma was a Chechen military commander and Islamic leader who fought for Chechnya and Circassia. He is considered the first leader of the resistance in Caucasus against Russian imperialism, and also against the Ottoman Turks. He led a major Chechen resistance movement in the late 18th century. This unique booklet presents a radical reform of the Qur'an and predicted a "great revolution" which was to be universal and egalitarian. Italian interest in Sheikh Mansur began in December 1785, with an entry in the Florentine Gazetta on his defeat of Russian troops. "The celebrated Sheikh Mansur's code for the reform of the Quran has been brought all the way from the Caucasus and promptly translated from Arabic into our language". (Venturi).

According to Franco Venturi and Alessandro Galante Garrone the most likely author is Filippo Buonarroti (Tuscan revolutionary). The pamphlet was published in 1786 and sold by the Pagani bookshop in Florence. It contains some prophecies that would mean many changes such as the spread of equality and republican ideas, preaching tolerance and deism, arguing against luxury and hoping for a more just society through widespread distribution of land in an original cocktail of ideas drawn from Rousseau, Abbé de Mably and others. A German edition was published in 1787.





Large 8vo (18 x 26.5 cm). Pp.(18). Paper wrappers. Rare Jesuit publication attributed to Tommaso Ceva. Deals with the Chinese Rites controversy, a dispute among Ro-




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man Catholic missionaries (Jesuits and the Dominicans and Franciscans) over the religiosity of Confucianism and Chinese rituals at the time. Part of a larger work "Risposta ad un libro contro le dodici riglessioni intitotalato Difesa del Giudizio formato dalla S. Sede Apostolico". Cf Cordier BS 906. Cf Sommervogel II, 1021. Pp. xxiv, 166. With photogravure frontispiece (after a photo by Henry Cave), two colour lithographic maps, twenty-four plates after photos, numerous illustrations in the text. Original pictorial wrappers, green cloth spine, inside covers illustrated.

Attractive and informative guide to the Ceylon Pavilion at the Paris World Fair of 1900. Contains information about the government, agriculture, exports, society, art and natural history, photography, etc. One chapter is devoted to the tea industry in the country. Lavishly illustrated. Rare.

Skeen, Government Printer, 1885. € 280 Pp. (iv), 137. Original printed paper boards, cloth spine. Loose in binding. Bookplates. Contains 1071 different species. The vernacular names are given in Sinhalese and Tamil, and in some cases also in English. ("Journal of the Ceylon Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society for 1885"). Scarce.

9 CHALMERS, JOHN

An Account of the Structure of Chinese Characters under 300 Primary Forms; After the Shwoh-Wan, 100, A.D., and the Phonetic Shwoh-Wan, 1833. London, Trübner & Co., 1882. € 480

Pp. (iv), x, 199. With two index tables, of which one large printed in red and black, the other loose. Original printed wrappers. Binding shaken, wrappers somewhat faded and rubbed, some staining to rear cover. First edition.

A valuable work that shows the original forms of the characters followed by pronunciation in Cantonese, Pekingese (Mandarin) and the English translation. John Chalmers, Scottish born who came to Hong Kong in 1852 as a missionary. In 1859 he moved to the Canton Mission where he stayed for twenty years before returning to Hong Kong. He compiled a number of dictionaries, wrote several essays and made translations. Cordier BS 1743.

10 CHAMBERS, ROBERT

Tracings of Iceland & The Faroe Islands. London and Edinburgh, Printed by W. and R. Chambers, 1856. € 750

Pp. (iv), 85. With frontispiece, a vignette and two maps in the text. As issued in original green glossed paper wrapper, printed in black, lightly rubbed. Old ownership signature on front wrapper. Rare, first separate edition of a geological treatise.

Chambers was a noted scientific geologist, mainly known for his "Vestiges of the Natural history of Creation" (1844), a speculative work on natural history. He carried out geological surveys during his travels in Scandinavia and Canada. This work devoted to Iceland and the Faroe Islands was originally published in Chamber's Edinburgh Journal in the previous year. It was translated into Danish in 1855. Fiske I:86.

Folio. Complete, unused set of eight printed leaves on heavy paper with cut-out figures, one colour plate and one printed instruction leaf. Some with small tears or chipped at corners, but overall it's well-kept. Housed in the original colour decorated envelope, chipped along edges. (Size: 38×29.5 cm). Bradley produced a series of village models for children which showed the people of a particular country and the houses they lived in.

16mo. Pp (16). Original colour decorated boards. With the unusual dust jacket, some minor browning and small insignificant paper loss at lower edge. Ottilia Adelborg (1855–1936) was a Swedish artist and children's book il-

lustrator. A charming calendar in exceptionally good condition.

With a coloured map at end and many colour photos in the text. Original cream-coloured paper boards, front wrapper with embossed decoration. Boards lightly rubbed. An appealing guidebook, scarce.

14 COBBOLD, REV. ROBERT HENRY

Pictures of the Chinese. Drawn by Themselves. London, John Murray, 1860. € 600

Pp. vi, 219. With frontispiece, 34 full page drawing illustrations and many textual illustrations. Near contemporary half calf on marbled boards, somewhat rubbed. Old ownership signature on title page. Some minor staining. First edition of a charming work about various Chinese professions each accompanied by a pen-and-ink etching by a native artist. Some examples: the lantern-seller, the blind fortune-teller, the opium smoker, the physiognomy, the scavenger, street beggars, etc. The author served as Archdeacon at the treaty port of Ningpo for a period of eight years. 15 CONSTANT, SAMUEL VICTOR

Calls, Sounds and Merchandise of the Peking Street Peddlers. Peking, The Camel Bell, [1936]. €4200

Oblong 8vo. Pp. xiv, 66, 65–88, 87–185 + one leaf with the "Pa Kua", 61 coloured lithograph plates of peddlers, 16 tipped-in halftone photographs, one paper pattern and one diagram. As issued in original boards covered with beautiful multicoloured silk, printed title label on upper cover. Housed in the original decorated paper case, worn.

First edition of this charming and informative work on street vendors in Peking. It describes 54 different kinds of peddlers including their characteristic sound or call, and what they have to sell, buy, or trade. Each is accompanied by an illustration of the vendor himself and his commodity. A few examples: the melon seed trader, "feet fixer", "moon cake" vendor, travelling magicians, "bundle cake" peddler, "used silver" buyer, and different kinds of fortune tellers. Constant's original work was presented as part of his Maste's degree at the California College in China (April 1936). A beautiful copy well-protected in the rare original folder.

Large 8vo (24.5 x 18.5 cm). Pp. 44. With one coloured map and twenty-one plates (with 42 illustrations). Original grey cloth, vellum spine, upper cover lettered and illustrated in gilt, lightly rubbed. Association copy, with the ownership inscription of Louisa C. Crichton. Exceedingly rare.

An interesting travel diary about a camping trip on horseback through Palestine, Syria and Lebanon. The travelling party included Lady Emma Crichton and her husband Colonel Sir Henry Crichton, Lord Northbrook and Lord Baring. The journey went from Jaffa to Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Jericho, Nazareth, The Sea of Galilee, Banias, Damascus and Baalbek. The fine illustrations are after sketches and paintings by the author and her husband and some by the Earl of Northbrook.

A charming collection comprising two catalogues about Cairo, three about Luxor, one of the Nile and one of Aswan. Each one contains four leaves (except one of Luxor with only two leaves). With informative text in English, richly illustrated. Original colourful pictorial paper covers. All well-preserved.

An exquisite women's calendar published by the famous French fashion house Fourrures Max (with the gazelle as its logo) to distribute to their customers. Text by Michel Georges-Michel, Robert de Montesquiou and others. Illustrated headpieces in shades of black, one facsimile plate and four lovely pochoir images highlighted in gold and silver representing the four seasons. A very chic Art Deco trade catalogue, a very good copy.

19 FRÄHN, CHRISTIAN MARTIN

4to. Pp.(ii), 62, 6. With text in Latin and Arabic. Disbound. Stamp and library number from Biblioteka Nakryska Strawinskego. First edition, rare. (Later the same year, it came out as a separate edition).

Christian Martin Frähn (1782–1851), celebrated German and Russian numismatist and historian. He was the head of the oriental languages department of Kazan University and later director of the Asiatic Museum in St. Petersburg. He produced more than 150 works on the study of oriental languages and numismatics. These include the discovery and publication of new material on the history of Russia, the Slavs and the peoples who lived, past and present, in the Russian Empire (Bulgarians, Tatars, Khazars, etc). This extensive work is devoted to the Turkic languages in Central Asia with references to Uyghur, Persian, Arabic, etc.


Pp. 319. Publisher's cloth in original pictorial dust jacket, small tear at upper spine of the jacket but otherwise an excellent copy. A novel that is an artistic imagination of ancient China originally published in French in 1869. Judith Gautier was a famous French poet, translator and historical novelist. Her translations were among the earliest to attract attention of modern European poets to Chinese and Japanese poetry. Cf. Vicaire III, 879.

Wrappers with some wear. First few leaves of second volume with minor staining otherwise a clean, crisp copy. Scarce French edition, originally published in Russian, and later translated into Dutch, German, French and English.

Vasilij MikhaIlovich Golovnin (1776–1831) was a Russian naval officer and a member of the Russian Imperial Academy of Science. He was commissioned by the Russian government to survey the coasts of Kamchatka and



the Kuril islands. In 1811 while attempting to chart the strait between Iturup (Etorofu) and Hokkaido he was captured by the Japanese and imprisoned for two years in Matsumae on the island of Hokkaido. This famous work about his captivity in Japan contains an honest and accurate description of the country and its people during a time when Japan was closed to foreigners.



EGEDE, PAUL (POUL HANSEN)

Pp. (xii), 284. Text in Danish. With engraved front portrait, one folding engraved map (tear along fold) and three engraved plates. Contemporary half calf, flat spine with title label (chipped), binding rubbed. Old ownership signature.

First edition based on Paul Egede's journal. He was a Danish-Norwegian missionary and scholar who at a young age moved to Greenland with his family. His father Hans Poulsen Egede, known as the Apostle of Greenland, started the missionary work in Greenland in 1721. Paul continued his father's work as a missionary among the Kalaallit people (Inuits). Bibliographia Groenlandica p. 38, no. 70.


This important work on the peoples of central Eurasia includes the first scholarly study of the Mongols based on Islamic and Chinese sources. Joseph de Guignes (1721–1800) was a renowned French orientalist who succeeded Étienne Fourmont at the Bibliothèque royale in Paris. He maintained that the Chinese nations had their origins in Egyptian colonisation, a view to which, despite all refutations, he stubbornly adhered. The second volume contains an extensive study of China, its history, legislation and science. Cf Atabey 535. Cordier BS 2768. Löwendahl 1507 (diff. pag.).

24 HAWTAYNE, GEORGE HAMMOND West Indian Yarns by 'X. Beke'. Demerara, J. Thomson, publisher, Georgetown, 1884. € 320

Pp. (iv), 137. With some staining. Contemporary half calf, printed title on upper cover and title label on spine, rubbed and stained. First edition in book-form. A collection of humorous stories by a British colonial administrator of British Guiana 1881–99. Demerara is a historical region in the Guianas, today part of Guyana. Previously published in the newspaper Argosy. Scarce.

25 HEYERDAHL, THOR / [Advance Copy] Expedition Kon-Tiki. Stockholm, A. Bonniers, 1949. €1000

Pp. 206. With two maps (one coloured folded) and many photo illustrations. As issued in original printed wrappers. Housed in an artistic custom-made box. Advance copy of the first Swedish edition, translated by Bengt Danielsson, member of the expedition. Exceptional copy with a dedication by Yvonne and Thor Heyerdahl.



The Kon-Tiki was a raft in which the Norwegian explorer Thor Heyerdahl sailed across the Pacific Ocean from South America to the Polynesian islands in 1947. Heyerdahl's book about his experience was first published in Norwegian in 1948 and became a best-seller. It was republished and translated into several languages. The original Kon-Tiki raft is now on display at a museum in Bygdøy (Oslo).

The dedication is written by Thor to bookseller J.H. Nilsson on the front endpaper (translated): "[you] should have come with us on the journey and taken care of the half-women mermaids we met on arrival, i.e. those who were created as mermaids from the waist up, and as humans from the waist down! ". Above a drawing of a mermaid by his wife Yvonne together with a hearty greeting. The cover has some light discolouration, and a few small tears, the endpaper partly browned but a very good copy.

26 HOPKIN, H.L. & SLACK, TOM A. (Ill.) A Touch of the Sun. Bangkok, privately published, 1913. €700

Pp. (viii), 41. With ten illustrated plates and three more sketches in the text. Original boards, decorated front cover printed in red and black. Some staining to covers. Rare work about life and characters of Bangkok including the postman, the policeman, the Durwan, a secretary, etc. Contains verses and short stories by Hopkin illustrated by Slack. Some marks at inner margin but overall a good copy.

27 [IKEBANA MANUSCRIPT]

容真流 四季之巻 yōshin-ryû. Shiki no kan. (Four Seasons. Sense of expression). Two volumes. Japan mid 19th century. €2600

Anonymously published manuscript illustrating 144 exquisite water colours of flower arrangements. Size: 19.5 x 26.5 cm. Complete in two volumes comprising 78 leaves folded in the traditional Japanese fashion (fukuro-toji). Including title, one portrait of Senkei, colophons and two blank lvs. Original paper wrappers with title labels on front covers, some wear along edges. Housed in a modern slip-case. With old ownership stamp.

The Japanese ikebana tradition dates back to the 15th century. Over the years, schools with different specialities and styles developed. The Yōshin-Go-ryô school was established by Seriyusai Sakurai in the 1840s. He was a Buddhist monk of the Sōtō Zen school and became a master of flower at the famous temple Ninna-ji in Kyoto. He created a new ikebana style that emphasised the idea



of sophisticated simplicity and natural beauty. The first volume illustrates beautiful arrangements representing the four seasons. The second volume is mainly devoted to arrangements of green leaves and bamboo stands placed in special design pottery. Occasionally some light staining but overall a lovely example of Yōshin-ryû ikebana.

29 [INUIT NEWSPAPER]

BERTELSEN, RASMUS (Ed.) & MØLLER, LARS (Printer)

The collection contains 37 issues of the first Inuit newspaper. 4to. (20.8 x 26.7 cm). Title page printed in gold. Each issue with four leaves of text. Comprises 46 pages of illustrations, of which six double page and several with multiple images. Uncut and partly unopened. Bound in near contemporary black patterned cloth on boards. Printed title label on spine, small loss. A rare survivor in excellent condition.

Atuagagdliutit was founded in 1861 by the Danish geologist Hinrich Johannes Rink, the Royal Inspector of South Greenland, and his wife Signe Rink. The newspaper covered both local news (e.g. hunting and fishing) and foreign matters. For a long time it was the only source of information about the outside world that the Greenlanders had. All the lithographs are after drawings by native artists, Aron of Kangeq and others, and printed by Lars Möller in Godthaab. The newspaper was printed in a very small edition, read extensively and the illustrations were often removed. Many copies have therefore not survived.

Provenance: Nile Fries (1912–94, Swedish professor of botany. According to a pencil notation the copy was bought at Rosenkilder & Bager in Copenhagen in 1975.

30 [JAPANESE TEXTILE SAMPLES]

"Kogire-cho" [An album with ancient exclusive fabric samples]. End of 18th century or beginning of 19th century. €1200

An appealing collector's album with old selected textile samples. (Size: 11.3 x 15.3 x 4 cm). Leporello-folded. Thirty pages with several swatches on each page (on one side only). The samples are pasted on plain white paper surrounded by gilt paper. Cloth binding, rubbed. A few small wormholes. Housed in an old wooden box (19th century). The collection comprises 178 different sublime samples including beautiful Kiran and Donsu brocade and damask using gold or silver threads. Also samples of Sarasa chintz are inserted. A charming and exclusive album with a lovely collection of superior Japanese textiles. We don't know the owner of the album but we believe the collection was assembled by a knowledgeable textile connoisseur.

Very rare work by two American women missionaries serving in Burma.

Sarah Hall, American-born missionary, arrived in Burma in 1827 together with her first husband George Broadman. Eventually they settled in Tavoy where they established schools and church for the Karen people. Broadman died in 1831 and a few years later Sarah married missionary Adoniram Judson, one of the pioneers of missionary work in Burma. Sarah made many translations of scriptures, devotional poetry, prepared a hymn book and compiled several books of scripture questions for Sunday schools.


Due to poor health Sarah, along with her husband, was on her way home to the USA when she died on St Helena in 1845. Emily Chubbock (with the pen name Fanny Forester) became Adoniram Judson's third wife. They sailed together for Burma in 1846 and there Emily devoted herself to missionary work, wrote and translated several works. She compiled the second part of this work, a continuation of the first part made by Sarah, here posthumously published.

"I am now engaged in writing questions on the Acts of the Apostles, in Burmese, for the use of the Bible Classes and Sabbath School. We have a Sabbath School, numbering nearly a hundred children, and a Bible Class of twenty adults" (Fanny Forrester "Memoir of Sarah B. Judson" 1860, p. 162). Not in Cordier.

Tyra Kleen (1874–1951) was a renowned Swedish artist who spent many years in Asia. She came to Indonesia in 1919 and became particularly fascinated by the theatre and art of dances in Java and Bali. This work is devoted to Vajang, the ancient theatre tradition of Java. The author describes in detail the procedure of a Vajang performance including beautiful illustrations made after Tyra's watercolour drawings. Provenance: Hanna Maria Palme (1861–1959), Swedish social activist and grandmother of Olof Palme (the late well-known prime minister).



The Great Learning was one of the Four Books in Confucianism attributed to Zengzi, one of Confucius' disciples. The Great Learning became the gateway to serious study for generations of Confucian scholars. In Korea it was considered one of the Classics. The Hangul alphabet was invented in 1443 by King Sejong the Great as part of an ambitious programme of language reform to increase literacy. A large number of books were printed during his reign.

The design of the font was constantly amended to improve the appearance of the text. The Kabin font became the most popular type of the Choson period (1392–1910), and was recast more than seven times before the 20th century.

The Chinese Rites Controversy and the Roman position regarding ancestor worship affected Vietnamese Catholicism as well, profoundly and extensively, even until today. The Dominicans and the Augustinians in contrast to the Jesuits refused any adaptation to local customs and were horrified by the practices of the Jesuits. Benito Llobresols was born in Gerona and served as Apostolic missionary in Tonkin between 1754 –1762.

This collection of fashion plates consists of 111 chromolithographic plates with multiple images and 74 textile samples pasted in on paper. Each fashion style is numbered and prices are added in pencil. Annotation in German on first leaf. Housed in a paper folder. We believe this manual used to belong to a buyer for a fashion store. The impressive collection includes the typical ultra-feminine and luxurious styles of the mid-1950s. The catalogue contains samples of shawls, stoles, knitwear, jersey wool blouses, summer dresses and skirts, sport wears, jackets, coats, dresses and sweaters decorated with gold and silver embroidery. The textile samples include shantung silk, linen, rustic linen, burlap, artificial synthetic, cotton, hemp etc. In fine condition.

The enterprise Luisa Spagnoli was founded by Luisa Sargentini in 1928. Upon her death the leadership was passed on to her son Mario and upon his death to his son Lino Spagnoli in 1953.



The plates depict several kinds of marbles titled: Vert de Mer, Jaune de Sienne, Chateau-Landon Rance, St. Anne, Marbre de Kolmården Granit, Portor, Bleu Fleurl Rance and Breche Violette. The initial mission of the expedition was to study conditions in northern China and "other military objectives" but was later expanded to also collect archaeological and ethnological material. The first part of this work contains Mannerheim's diary and the second contains scientific descriptions of the collections of many famous scientists. 



First German edition of this monumental work on Japan. First issue with title page printed 1669 (another issue 1670). Published in the same year as the original Dutch edition.

Arnold Montanus, a Dutch theologian and historian, based this work on journals from the Dutch East India Company as well as reports from Jesuit missionaries. A narrative of Japanese history, the people and their customs, religion, trade etc. seen through the eyes of European visitors who were very restricted at the time. For more than 200 years Japan was almost completely isolated form the rest of the world. The Dutch, who had established themselves on the island of Deshima outside Nagasaki, were the only foreigners (except for some Chinese) who were allowed to trade with Japan during this period (1641-1854). They had to renew the permission each year, for which they had to send a delegation from Deshima to the Shogun in Yedo. The reports of the visits between 1649 and 1661 provided Montanus with important material. His book has been criticized for not being sufficiently scientific and about the authenticity of the plates. 





William Gilbert Puckey (1805–78) arrived in New Zealand with his parents at the age of fourteen, learned the Maōri language and became an useful translator. 



Johann Alois Senefelder (1771–1834) thought of the invention only as a cheap method of reproduction, but by the 1830s, in the hands of Daumier, the lithograph had allied itself to the press and became a considerable force in public life. Before long some of the greatest artists of the century had realised its possibilities and were exploring the new graphic medium; and it quickly became an accepted form of artistic expression. His work is a practical guide to lithography and includes specimens of drawings executed at his press. Rare. Bigmore & Wyman, II, p. 348.

He spent four years on the islands learning about the life, customs and language of Tonga. He returned to England in 1810. His account is "considered the best report of Tongan life and culture before the arrival of Christianity" Hill 1075. Cf Kroepelien 819 (second edition).

Lady Mary's letters first published after her death (1763) became enormously popular and reissued many times. William Yates, British Baptist missionary and linguist who first came to India in 1815 where he worked together with William Carey at Serampore. In 1817 he moved with the Baptist Missionary Society to Calcutta where he founded a school and was involved in building chapels and other religious establishments in Calcutta and its vicinity. Yates composed many linguistic works and manuals of Sanskrit and Hindustani as well as handbooks of natural science and history for Indians. Vater p. 168.

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
