

1 ADELUNG, FRIEDRICH

Bibliotheca sanscrita. Literatur der Sanskrit-sprache. St.Petersburg, Karl Kray, 1837. € 500

Second enlarged edition (first 1830). An early bibliography of works relating to Sanskrit literature by Adelung, a renowned philologist and historian. Besterman 5571. Vater p. 330.

Pp. (ii), xxii, 430. Contemporary marbled boards, gilt spine, some light wear. With stamps of previous owners (Hans Böniger, Nartin Bodmer and Hans Peter Kraus).

A typographic "Tour de force". According to Schnurrer, the author is Michael Sabbagh. Marcel was in charge of the Imprimerie Nationale at the time and the director of the production of an "Oratio Dominica" including many exotic types cut by himself. Schnurrer, Bibl.



3 BERGGREN, JACOB

Resor i Europa och österländerne. Three vols. Stockholm 1826–28. € 1 200

First edition of an important travel account of the Levant by Jacob Berggren, chaplain at the Swedish embassy in Constantinople. Contains an accurate description of Constantinople and of his travels to Syria, Lebanon, the Holy Land and Jordan between 1820-22. An appendix deals with plants collected by Berggren and defined by the Swedish botanist Göran Wahlenberg. Krok p. 72. Röhricht 1689.

With three engraved titles, two engraved maps, one engraved plan and five folding tables of inscriptions in Syria. One blank leaf with price information on verso is not present (vol. III). Contemporary half calf, flat spines gilt, lightly rubbed. Occasionally some minor spotting.



4 BERGSTEDT, KARL FREDRIK (Translator)

First Swedish translation of the famous Indian story of the princess Savitri found in the ancient epics Mahabharata. Marklin 14. Zenker BO i, 3214.

5 BIZZARRI, PIETRO

Rerum persicarum historia, initia gentis, mores, instituta, resquegestas ad hæc usque tempora complectens. Francofurti 1601. €1800

Second enlarged edition (first 1583) of a classic work on Persia together with tracts relating to Persia and the Turks. Pietro Bizzari (1525-86) studied in Venice but converted to Protestantism at an early age and lived most of his life in England and Germany. His work covers the Persian history from antiquity up to the 1580s. Atabey 112. Diba p. 177. Schwab I, 47. Wilson p. 23.

6 BOSKOVI'C [BOSCOVICH], RUDJER JOSIB

Giornale di un viaggio da Constantinopoli in Polonia. Con una sua relazione delle Rovina de Troja. Bassano, a spese remondini di Venezia, 1784. €1500

Boscovi'c was born in 1711 in Ragusa (Dalmatia) and became a Jesuit diplomat and polymath who made several scientific and diplomatic missions around the world. He joined the British Ambassador Sir James



Porter to Constantinople in 1746. On his return journey he stayed in Warsaw for several months. It's possible that his MS was translated during that time since his friend Pierre Henin served at the French embassy there. Cf Atabey 137. Whyte p. 220.

First edition comprising an assortment of Oriental manuscripts preserved in the Royal Library of Paris. Cardonne, a French orientalist and translator who resided in Constantinople for about twenty years. Cioranescu 15566.

First edition. The first work is written as a diary dealing with Louis Des Hayes' stay in Denmark and his preparations for a diplomatic mission to Moscow concerning a commercial treaty for the Baltic Sea trade. The second work recounts Quiclet's journey to the Levant in 1658. He visited the cities of Ragusa, Sarajevo, Belgrade and Andrianopel (Edirne). At the end a picturesque description of Constantinople. It was published posthumously by Jean Promé. Blackmer 1360. Weber 317 (Quiclet).

10 DIEU, LUDOVIC DE

Rudimenta linguæ persicae. Accedunt duo priora capita Geneseos, ex Persica translatione Iac. Tawusi. Lugd. Bat., Ex off. Elzeviriana, 1639. €850

The first Persian grammar to be published, based on the work of Raymundus which existed only in manuscript form. According to various bibliographical sources, it seems uncertain whether Dieu was the real author. Jean Eichmann has sometimes been suggested as the author. Berghman 694. Diba p. 179. Schwab ii,727. First collected edition. Du Cange is the editor of the first work and the author of the second. The first work contains Villehardouin's account of the Conquest of Constantinople.

Villehardouin (ca 1150 - ca 1212), a French knight and historian, participated in and chronicled the Fourth Crusade (1202-4), which he began to write in 1207. The second work on the Latin Empire in the Levant is by Charles du Fresne, sieur du Cange (1620-88), an eminent French philologist and historian of the Middle Ages and Byzantium. Blackmer 501. First edition. Ferrieres-Sauveboeuf was a French diplomat who travelled for many years through the Levant, Persia, Arabia and the Caucasus. His account is rich in information about the countries, people, characters, religion, etc. and based mainly on his own observations. Contains much detail about the Turkish-Russian war of 1788-9. 13 GAFFAREL, JACQUES

Curiositez inouyes, sur la sculpture talismanique des Persans. Horoscope des Patriarches, et lecture des estoilles. No place 1637. € 1200

Scientific treatise on ancient talismanic magic and Jewish astrology (Kabbalah). Gaffarel (1601-81), French theologian and librarian to Cardinal Richelieu. Around 1623, Gaffarel travelled to Italy where he acquired a.o. the Kabbalah manuscripts of Giovanni Pico della Mirandola.

This work consists of four parts, the first part defends "the Oriental men" from Christian charges of superstition, the second is about the use of talismans or amulets by the Persians, the third part focuses on ancient Hebrew astrology and the last part deals with reading messages in the stars. Gaffarel then describes the "heavenly writing" or arrangement of stars into Hebrew characters, illustrated on the two plates. A Voyage in the Indian Ocean and to Bengal, undertaken in the years 1789 and 1790: Containing an account of the Sechelles Islands and Trincomale; the character and arts of the people of India; with some remarkable religious rites of the inhabitants of Bengal. To which is added, a Voyage in the Red Sea; including a description of Mocha, and of the trade of the Arabs of Yemen; ... Two vols in one. London 1803. € 1500

First English edition translated from the French (Paris 1801). The French naval officer Grandpré travelled via the Maldives to the Seychelles, India, Cochin China, Yemen and Ceylon. His informative account describes the customs of the people along the route, commerce and navigation, religious rites, coffee cultivation and the Arabic influence in India. Chadenat 555. 15 HARKNESS, HENRY

A Description of a Singular Aboriginal Race Inhabiting the Summit of the Neilgherry Hills, or Blue Mountains of Coimbatoor, in the Southern Peninsula of India. London 1832. €1000

First edition. A narrative of the Nilgiri Mountains, bordering the Karnataka Plateau and the states of Kerala in southern India. It's a mountainous region that was unknown to the British until 1818, but later became their favourite summer and weekend getaway.

16 HASE (HAAS, HASIUS, HAASE), JOHANN MATTHIAS

First edition of this historical and geographical description of the Holy Land and neighbouring regions. Hase (1684–1742), cartographer and professor of mathematics, compiled many geographical works and maps for the Homann company. The five large maps of Egypt, the Holy Land and the Near East are created by Hase. One map is missing. The second part contains a comparison of the greatest cities in the known world including Babylon, Rome, St. Petersburg, Yedo (Tokyo), Constantinople, London, etc. Graesse iii,217. Röhricht 1403. First edition. The author was in the service of the Nawab (governor) of Tonk, a small kingdom in present-day Rajasthan. The account begins with a description of the Tonk state, the administration and political intrigues. In 1870 the Nawab made a pilgrimage to Mecca and Hassan accompanied him. The journey starts from Bombay and continues via Aden and Jedda before reaching Mecca and Medina.





Reverend Heber, the Bishop of Calcutta, first arrived in India in 1823 and died in Madras in 1826. His work contains valuable information about the people and its culture. It's based on letters and diary entries and was published posthumously by his widow Amalia Heber. First published in quarto in the same year (1828). Lowndes ii, p. 1030. Riddick 123.

First edition of an important type specimen of the Hindustani language, rendered in Kaithi characters. Contains the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary and the Apostles' Creed and deals with the language and script used at the University of Kasí or Benares (Bihar). 20 [KANDY / CEYLON]

LE MESURIER, CECIL JOHN REGINALD & PA'NABOKKE, TIKIRI BANDARA Snr.

Niti-Nighanduva; or, The Vocabulary of Law. As it existed in the last days of the Kandyan kingdom. Colombo 1880. €1200

The Níti-Nighanduva is a Sinhalese law book which mainly deals with marriage and inheritance laws. The kingdom of Kandy was an independent monarchy in the central portion of the island Ceylon, absorbed into the British empire in 1815. The Sinhalese writer Pa'nabokke Banda, President of Dumbara, obtained a copy of the original English manuscript, had it transcribed and made a rough translation. In 1876 Le Mesurier seized the ms, retranslated it and recast it into its present form. Both the transcription and the translation are found in this work.

21 [LABROSSE, JOSEPH]. ANGELO (ANGELUS) À S. JOSEPH

... Gazophylacium linguæ Persarum, triplici linguarum clavi italicæ, latinæ, gallicæ, nec non specialibus præceptis ejusdem linguæ reseratum. Amsterdam, Ex Officina Janson-Waesberg, 1684. €3000

The first proper Persian-Latin dictionary to be published. Only preceded by Ravius' Specimen Lexici Arabico-Persico-Latini (Lugd. Bat. 1645) and the Persian section in Castell's Lexicon Heptaglotton (London 1669). The dictionary entries are in Italian followed by translations into Latin, French and Persian respectively. Includes an introduction mainly based on De Dieu.

Joseph Labrosse was a French Carmelite missionary and the first European to make a serious study of Persian medicine. He composed this work during a stay in the Levant between 1664 and 1679. He arranged for the printing in Amsterdam and purchased the small Arabic types at the Elzevier sale in 1681. The large Arabic types found on the title page and eight times in the text were cut by Guillaume Le Bé in Paris 1599. These types were used only occasionally in Paris until the end of the 18th century and it seems that this is the only time they were used outside France (Smitskamp). Schwab 672. Smitskamp PO 345. 22 LAWRENCE, THOMAS EDWARD

Seven Pillars of Wisdom, A Triumph. London, JonathanCape, 1935.€ 2 800

First trade edition, limited to 750 copies (# 68). Lawrence's famous autobiographical account of his legendary part in the Arab Revolt against the Ottoman Turks between the years 1916-18. He did not believe the text would be of interest to the general public and at first allowed only limited publications for friends (in 1922) and subscribers (in 1926). It is lavishly illustrated with photographic plates and portraits from sketches and folding maps. A handsome copy of this celebrated work, called by Churchill "one of the greatest books ever written in the English language". O'Brien Ao41.

First edition of a popular work at the time. The author, a French historian, covers here the history of the Caliphs from Mahomet to the death of Mostazem, period of more than six hundred years. Contains a long preface of earlier works by Herbelot, Rollin and Renaudot. Cox i, p. 228. Gay 3586. Graesse iii, 399. Thonnelier, B.O. 3225.

24 NORBERG, MATTHIAS (Transl.)

Codex syriaco-hexaplaris ambrosiano-mediolanensis. Volume one (all publ.). Lund, C. B. Berling, 1787. € 500

This is Norberg's translation of the prophecies of Ezekiel and Jeremiah taken from the Septuagint manuscript preserved in the Ambrosian Library in Milan. Norberg, a renowned Swedish orientalist who made a long journey to the Near East between 1777 and 1782. Darlow/Moule 8974.

25 [OTTOMAN TURKISH]

KEÇECIZÂDE IZZET MOLLA

Divan-i Izzet. Bulaq, Ma ba'at Ṣāḥib al-Sa'āadah, A.H. 1255 [1840]. € 2 000

First edition of a Divan by a great Ottoman poet. Izzet Molla was born in 1785 in Istanbul in a family of crafts-


men, he became a judge and active figure in political life protected by Halet Efendi, Ottoman diplomat and politician. Izzet Molla was exiled twice, to Kesan and to Sivas where he died in 1829. He is one of the most prominent Turkish poets of the 19th century. He composed two Divans (collection of poems) and three Mathnawis (poems written in rhymed couplets and usually have a subtle spiritual meaning), one of which is uncompleted. Second edition, first in 1762 without the map and illustrations. A thorough study of the Druze people, a relatively small religious sect based on an eclectic system of doctrines originated from the Near East. Contains a description of their commerce including

First French edition of this famous work of the Ottoman Empire based mainly on the author's personal experiences. First published in English in 1666/67 but most of that edition was destroyed in the Great Fire of London. Sir Paul Rycaut was a British diplomat who served as secretary to the British Ambassador in Constantinople between 1661 and 1667, and was later appointed consul in Smyrna (now Izmir). Cf Atabey 1069. TULLBERG, OTTO FREDRIK (Editor)

Malavika et Agnimitra. Drama indicum Kalidasae adscriptum. Textum primus edidit, in latinum covertit, varietatem scripturae et annotatinoes adiecit. Bonn ad Rhenum, H.B. Koenig, 1840. € 300

This is the first western printing of "Mãlavikã et Agnimitra", an Indian poetic and dramatic play written by Kalidasa. It is based on some events of the reign of Pushyamitra Shunga. Tullberg was a Swedish orientalist and musician. Zenker BO ii, 3338.

30 SEBASTIANI, GIUSEPPE DE SANTA MARIA

First edition of Sebastiani's account of his second voyage to India between 1660 and 1665. According to the preface, the first edition contained a number of errors regarding the Japanese and Chinese names of animals, plants and minerals that needed to be corrected. This has been done in the second edition with the help of Yanagawa Sunsam, Tanaka Yosiwo and others. Very rare.


